The Society continued to promote the recorder as a serious instrument, to facilitate the raising of standards, and provide opportunities for playing to all who join, through group playing in branch meetings and larger Festivals, workshops, competitions and examinations.

Notice was received of a forthcoming legacy from the late Arthur Ingram. Discussions are continuing on the use of this in furtherance of our charitable objectives. During the year initial planning took place for promoting a new National Youth Recorder Orchestra, which will take place over a week in June 2002; and for conductors' workshops in autumn 2001 and subsequent years.

The **Walter Bergmann Fund**, administered by a Sub-Committee, continued to give grants to further the studies of young players in financial need. Many members contributed to the fund-raising in various ways. The **CSRP** (certificate for conductors and directors), was administered by the Examinations Sub-Committee.

Branches undertook activities in the wider community. Examples included: playing in public places like shopping centres, with charitable collections; workshops in primary schools; performances in residential and nursing homes and hospices and at church services; public performances that increase public perceptions that the recorder is a serious and enjoyable instrument. The **SRP National Recorder Festival** was held on 21 and 22 April 2001 in Bristol. The **SRP Scottish Recorder Festival** was held on 16 June 2001 in Alva, Clackmannanshire.

The membership supplied **The Recorder Magazine** (published by Peacock Press) quarterly to members. The Society has editorship of four pages in each issue to communicate with members and publicise itself. The Society's Internet site <http://www.srp.org.uk/> continued to be developed as a public information resource.
