Dorothee Oberlinger, born 1969 in Aachen (Germany), studied recorder with Günther Höller at the Musikhochshule Köln and with Walter van Hauwe at the Sweelinck-Conservatorium Amsterdam. She has won several national and international prizes, including a prize in the 1996 Solo Competition of the European Recorder Teachers' Association (ERTA) for contemporary music and the 1997 the Moeck/SRP Solo Recorder Competition. Since 1985 she has given concerts in Germany, the Netherlands and Italy as a soloist and with several ensembles and orchestras (including Darmstädter Kammerorchester and Folkwang Kammerorchester Essen) and has taken part in CD and TV productions. Apart from her interest in contemporary music, Dorothee Oberlinger has founded several ensembles, among others "Bois de Cologne" which interprets music of the 14th century and "Das Neue Ensemble" with main interests in the 17th century. Since 1996 she has worked with the Cello player Elisabeth Wand. In this combination she plays especially the new tenor recorder by Maarten Helder, which is designed particularly for contemporary music. Dorothee Oberlinger lives and teaches in Cologne.

Elisabeth Wand was born 1968 in Grevenbroich, Germany and began to play the Cello in 1974. Since 1976 she has won several prizes in the competition "Jugend musiziert". In 1986 she began sudy as a "junior student" with Prof. J. Herzbruch at the Musikhochshule Köln. From 1988 to 1993 she studied with Mrs Prof. I. Güdel at the Athe Hochshule für Musik Detmold. From 1994 to 1996 she studied with Michael Kasper at the Musikhochshule Köln abt. Aachen.

The Moeck/SRP Solo Recorder Competition aims to encourage young players of talent (under 30 years of age) and help them in their professional aspirations. Competitors had to show that they are able to sustain a whole recital programme showing the different facets of the recorder and its repertoire. The 1997 Finals were judged on 6 September 1997 by the Amsterdam Loeki Stardust Quartet.
