Programme note for Intrata giocosa.

Hans Gál (1890-1987) had considerable success as a Vienna composer in the 1920s. He was Director of the Conservatory in Mainz from 1929. Hitler's accession to power in 1933 led to his instant dismissal and the banning of all his works. He returned to Vienna, but was again forced to flee by Hitler's annexation of Austria in 1938. He emigrated to Britain and settled in Edinburgh, where he remained active until his death. He was President of the Edinburgh branch of the Society of Recorder Players from its foundation in 1957, also Vice-President of the national Society. We have fond memories of his attendance at all our concerts and, until late in his life, Annual General Meetings. Among his large output are a dozen compositions for recorder. *Intrata giocosa* was premiered in 1959 by the branch with, as soloists, the leading recorder exponents of the day (Carl Dolmetsch, Freda Dinn, Edgar Hunt and Walter Bergmann). It was last performed at our 25th anniversary concert.
