But it was time for tea – and a lovely selection of cakes presented by Diana and Neil.

After tea we continued with the Mendelssohn for a few minutes, before looking at the wonderful *Foxtrot* and *Celebration Rag* by **Lyndon Hilling**. The basses really enjoyed their section of the music, and felt like standing up as in a jazz band.

The afternoon concluded with another gentle piece – **Thomas Ravenscroft's** *Fantasia* (s bit of symmetry here?). this is a beautiful work with a lot of interest in all of the parts, and gave a fitting ending to our lovely afternoon of music making – many thanks, Robin, for so competently leading us through this lovely selection.
