Additional cash prizes are awarded by the Society of Recorder Players Prizes will be presented immediately after the final of the competition.

## **Entries**

The competition welcomes international entries from recorder players who are of a suitable standard and are under 30 years of age on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2017. Previous winners are not eligible to enter.

Competitors are asked to submit a 30-minute recording to Sarah Langdon, via Google Drive – which is shared with administrator using the email address <a href="mailto:sarahlangdonmusic@gmail.com">sarahlangdonmusic@gmail.com</a>.

Entries must be submitted by 31st March 2017 along with the entry form & registration fee of £90 sterling.

Cheques must be made payable to 'The Society of Recorder Players.' See notes below for other payment methods.

Please contact the administrator if you wish to submit a recording in a different format.

The recordings should show a cross-section of different aspects of the recorder and its repertoire. This must include the set work; detailed below. Finalists will be selected, based on the submitted recording, and will be invited to perform in front of the adjudicators and a public audience during the 2017 Greenwich International Festival & Exhibition of Early Music – which will take place in November 2017.

Entrants will be informed of the results of the preliminary round by 31<sup>st</sup> July 2017.

Finalists are required to send the details of their final programme by 8<sup>th</sup> September 2017; this should last approximately 45 minutes and include a cross section of the recorder and its repertoire. It must also include the set work for the 2017 finals: **Fantasia no. 9 by Telemann** 

Finalists will be expected to provide their own accompanist(s) who should be available for the winner's recital in the event of the competitor winning the first prize.

The adjudicators' decision will be final
